The story "Until Hell Calls Our Names," in the anthology More Monsters From Memphis (reprinted in Undead Tales, 2011), was winner of the 1999 Darrell Award of the Memphis Science Fiction Association, and garnered an Honorable Mention in *The Year's Best Fantasy & Horror* (12th ed.). The story "Icewall," in the anthology Robert Bloch's Psychos, made the Preliminary Ballot for the Bram Stoker Award and was named an Honorable Mention in *The Year's Best* Fantasy & Horror (11th ed.). Two "Ghosts of the IRA" stories (included in Shadowplays) by W. D. Gagliani have also won 2nd Prizes in consecutive Science Fiction Writers of Earth annual contests (Edward Bryant, judge).
